Our Foundation Has allocated fund this year out to:

~\$2,000.00: NAC Foundation- National Arts Center- (Ottawa) Music workshops for those with autism-touch, listen, play. Music program in Ottawa is aiming to gently introduce kids with autism and Aspergers Syndrome to live tunes. The Lotus Centre for Special Music Education teamed up with the National Arts Centre (NAC) to develop music workshops for six-to-12-year-olds with special needs and their parents. The approach that Liz and Erin take is tailor-made to autistic children or those with Aspergers, some of whom may be fascinated by textures, whether tactile or sonic, and are keen to express their ideas, but find any kind of group "experience" almost impossible to tolerate. A certain way of engaging with music -story (VIDEO)- A Musical experience for autistic children

~\$2,000.00: <u>Autism Aspergers Friendship Society of Calgary</u>- Therapeutic Riding Lessons. AAFS provides respite care in a social and recreational environment for children, youth and adults on the spectrum of Autism; this includes, but is not limited to, Autism, Aspergers, Pervasive Developmental Disorder, Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder and Non-Verbal Learning Disorder.

~\$2,300.00: Proset Autism (Quebec)Program on Development i.e.: Eye Contact, Concentration skills, motor development, participation and motivation. 5 global skills 1) Joint attention. We are working on eye-contact with their peers and coaches 2) Concentration skills. Staying focused with the goal at hand i.e. hitting a forehand 3) Motor development. Gross and Fine motor skills i.e. holding a ball on the racket 4)Participation. Joining in a variety of games, that underscore team work 5) Motivation. Identifying the strengths of the children skills and combining the reinforcement that each child needs to maintain their level of performance

~\\$5,734.58: Family Resource Association of British Columbia-Two weeks of summer camp for 8 youths ages 12-18 yrs of age. Therapeutic Camp-Mentorship and Socialize. FRP-BC supports Family Resource Programs in furthering their mandate to strengthen parenting and the healthy development of children within the context of the family. The BC Association of Family Resource Programs promotes the Family Resource Program model as a community hub where both Canadian born families and those new to Canada can access family support, opportunities for engagement, and community resources.

~\$3,000.00: Camp Kennebec- (Ontario)- Partial Funding for 6 families- Daily Living Skills, activities, excursions daily balanced meals and so much more for kids & Teens and over night stays and more. Camp Kennebec, a wonderful summer camp for kids and teens with special needs, learning disabilities, and developmental delays including autism, Aspergers, ADHD, ADD, OCD, brain injury, anxiety, social skill and other challenges.
