WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- Families with one child aged 4 to 17 with an autism spectrum disorder (ASD).
- Both biological parents and siblings aged 4 or older willing to participate.
- Child with ASD and family relatives must be English speaking.

Be one of 2000 families to participate in this important initiative and help us to uncover the causes of autism!

FAMILIES WILL RECEIVE:

- A written report and feedback
- A free assessment for the child with ASD

- Participating in a research assessment at the Montreal Children's Hospital.
- Family members donate blood, a source of DNA. The samples will be stored without identifying information to protect the privacy of individuals and families.
