- * Promoting national autism awareness

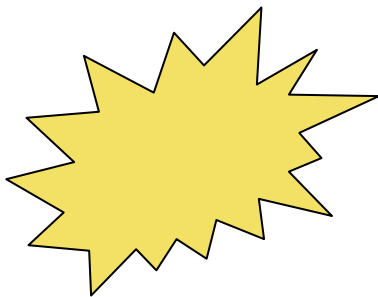
Mission Statement
